Prof. Sally Bushell is Professor of Romantic and Victorian Literature in the Department of English Literature & Creative Writing at Lancaster University.




David Wood OBE is an actor, author, director and producer best known to TARS as the script writer of the 1974 *Swallows and Amazons* film.


